**Wassailing**! An ancient practice of blessing Apple Orchards to ensure that there is a plentiful crop of wonderful apples the following year.

How? We lead a procession, torch lit, into the Orchard where upon we gather around a tree. We hold a short ceremony; hang pieces of toast from the branches of the tree and pour apple juice around the base of the tree as a present to the tree! We then make lots of noise with drums, bells and anything else musical that people bring along to scare away any evil spirits! A special Wassail song is sung, some fireworks are let off and we then retire to the Tea room garden, cups of mulled apple juice and Wassail cake.

Please come and join us - and bring something to make a noise with - a musical instrument or even a saucepan and a spoon! A torch or lantern is also useful. We ask for a donation from people (suggestion of  $\pounds$ 2).

Please let us know if you would like to come and join us.

Please note that if you are thinking of bringing your dog that there is a short firework display, there are sparklers and a lot of noise.

The event lasts around 1 hour.
